Physiotherapist Community Stroke Rehab Full-time

POSITION SUMMARY:

Working to develop and execute personalized treatment plans aimed at maximizing functional recovery and improving overall quality of life for our patients.

Position Requirements:

- Must have a degree in Physiotherapy from an accredited institution. A master's degree in Physiotherapy is preferred.
- Current registration with the College of Physiotherapist of Ontario (CPO) and a valid license to practice physiotherapy in Ontario.
- Minimum of 2 years of clinical experience in a similar rehabilitation setting, with a strong background in stroke rehabilitation preferred.
- Must have expertise in assessing and treating stroke-related impairments and functional limitations
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Ability to develop and implement evidence-based treatment plans and interventions.
- Proficient in using medical electronic medical record systems and clinical documentation.
- Compassionate, patient-focused.

Position Responsibilities:

- Assessment & Evaluation: Conduct thorough initial assessments and ongoing
 evaluations of patients to determine their physical capabilities, limitations, and

- **Treatment Planning:** Develop and implement individualized treatment plans based on evidence-based practices and patient-centered goals.
- **Rehabilitation Interventions:** Provide direct physiotherapy treatments, including manual therapy, exercise programs, functional training, and patient education.

Team Collaboration: Work closely with physicians, occupational therapists, speech-language pathologists, and other healthcare professionals to coordinate comprehensive care plans.

- **Patient & Family Education:** Educate patients and their families about stroke recovery processes, self-management strategies, and home exercise programs.
- **Documentation & Reporting:** Maintain accurate and up-to-date patient records, progress notes, and treatment reports in accordance with hospital policies and professional standards.
- **Community Outreach:** Engage in community education and outreach initiatives to raise awareness about stroke prevention, recovery, and available rehabilitation services.
