# Speech-Language Pathologist Community Stroke Part-time

#### **POSITION SUMMARY:**

Working collaboratively with a multidisciplinary team to support patients in improving their communication, swallowing, and cognitive-communication skills.

## **Position Requirements:**

- Master's Degree in Speech-Language Pathology from an accredited institution.
- Current registration with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario (CASLPO) and a valid license to practice as a Speech-Language Pathologist in Ontario.
- Minimum of 1-2 years of clinical experience in a similar rehabilitation setting, with experience in stroke rehabilitation preferred.
- Expertise in the assessment and treatment of speech, language, cognitive-communication, and swallowing disorders related to stroke. Strong interpersonal and communication skills for effective interaction with patients, families, and multidisciplinary team members. Implement effective, evidence-based treatment plans and interventions. Proficiency in using electronic medical records and clinical documentation. Patient-centered, empathetic, and dedicated to achieving the best outcomes for patients. Excellent organizational and problem-solving skills are essential.

#### **Position Responsibilities:**

- **Assessment & Evaluation:** Perform detailed assessments of patients' speech, language, communication, and swallowing abilities to identify impairments and establish rehabilitation goals.
- **Treatment Planning:** Develop and implement individualized treatment plans based on the assessment results, patient needs, and evidence-based practices for stroke rehabilitation.
- Therapeutic Interventions: Deliver therapeutic interventions to address speech disorders, language difficulties, cognitive-communication challenges, and swallowing disorders, using a variety of techniques and approaches.
- **Patient & Family Education:** Educate patients and their families about communication strategies, swallowing techniques, and home exercises to support the rehabilitation process.
- Documentation & Reporting: Maintain accurate and comprehensive documentation of patient
  assessments, treatment plans, progress notes, and outcomes in accordance with hospital policies
  and professional standards.
- **Team Collaboration:** Work closely with physiotherapists, occupational therapists, physicians, and other healthcare professionals to coordinate care and contribute to a holistic rehabilitation approach.
- **Community Outreach:** Participate in community education efforts to raise awareness about stroke prevention, recovery, and available rehabilitation services.
